



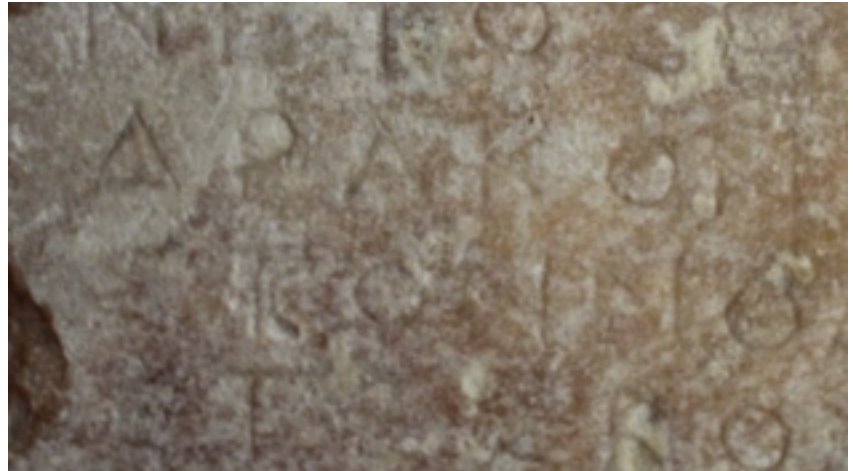

- eg. Draco's Law Code, 621 BCE



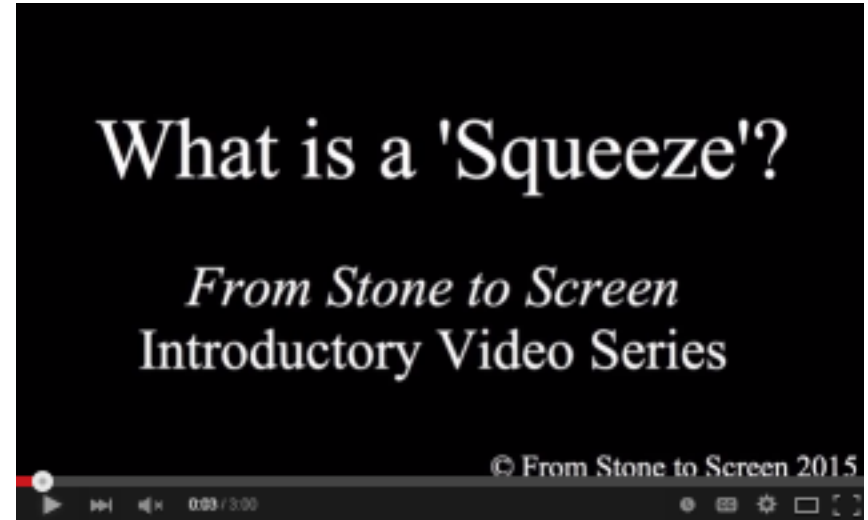
Epigraphic Squeezes
