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
## Books@Atla Open Press

2014 – installed PKP Open Monograph Press as means of publishing memberauthored works and hosting digital reprints – https://books.atla.com

2017/18 - Establish as a professional, scholarly and legitimate press: seated editorial board, adopted review policies and procedures; prepared new author contract using Model Digital Scholarship Agreement; drafted author instructions and guidelines – not just member authored works

2018 – began beta test of Editoria – web based monograph editing and production (export to PDF and EPUB)

# Workflow and Needs

#### **Proposal and Selection**

- <u>Workflow</u> prospective authors submit a proposal through OMP for review and acceptance by Editorial Board with acceptance of proposal initiating invite to submit manuscript
- <u>Needs</u> OMP not designed for proposal submission and review process which has forced us to develop workaround utilizing discussion area need to have development of this stage in OMP

#### **Manuscript Preparation and Review**

- <u>Workflow</u> review of completed manuscripts had been reliant upon track changes in Word and submission of multiple files through OMP document management system
- Needs –collaborative space to perform editorial review/commenting and author revision as well as professional copyediting that is less reliant on Word and potential for errors/corrupt files/versioning confusion

### **Copyediting and Layout**

- <u>Workflow</u> Contracted with external proofreaders and designers to copy edit text utilizing marked up PDFs/Word track changes and do design in Adobe InDesign
- Needs Save money on production costs and bring more of process in house; make process more efficient

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# Solutions and Next Steps

#### **Proposal and Selection**

- Attended PKP Spring (Pittsburgh) working with PKP staff on developing a new stage or functionality to accommodate proposal submission and review
- We still prefer OMP for managing process, communication and storefront

#### **Manuscript Preparation and Review**

- Adopted Editoria (Coko/PubSweet) in October 2018 as a compliment to OMP for the purpose of conducting editorial review/author revision
- Manuscripts transferred from OMP to Editoria
- Editoria (https://editoria.pub/) is a web based open source software allowing real time and collaborative review, revisions and copyediting

#### **Copyediting and Layout**

- Created new position in house (Scholarly Communication Coordinator) who will perform all
  copyediting and layout tasks for Press as well as provide support to editors
- Editoria allows export to PDF and EPUB in customized template, utilizing PagedJS to make on the fly adjustments to CSS still very much in development necessitating patience

- Contributed to OMP documentation
- Plan to submit internal workflow documentation to PKP Community as template
- Dedicated Editoria template to community for reuse
- Attend PKP and Editoria conferences/community meetings to dialogue with other users and contribute to feature development and platform feedback

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
